### Program Request - Abbreviated Template University of Utah Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy Studies Discontinuation August 2015

# Section I: Request

The Division of Occupational Therapy would like to discontinue the Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy Studies. The last Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy Studies degree will be awarded in August 2015.

## Section II: Need

The Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy Studies degree was put into place so that students could enter the graduate Master's program in occupational therapy in their senior year of undergraduate study and receive a bachelor's degree after the first year in the professional program. The Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy Studies does not have the requirements needed for professional practice. The profession of occupational therapy is moving toward a clinical doctorate degree (OTD) as the minimum degree needed for occupational therapists to enter practice. Accreditation standards for the OTD program require that all students enter the program already having earned a Bachelor's degree. Therefore, the Division of Occupational Therapy will no longer be admitting students who are undergraduate seniors and will have no need for the Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy Studies degree.

### Section III: Institutional Impact

There is no impact in the Division of Occupational Therapy. We will continue to admit the same number of students into the entry-level occupational therapy program. When the Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy Studies degree is discontinued, all students must complete a bachelor's degree prior to starting in the professional program. As a result, students will be seeking other related majors to finish thus positively increasing student credit hours and graduation rates for those disciplines. There will be no change in the Division's faculty or staff.

## Section IV: Finances

The discontinuation of the Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy Studies will not impact the finances of the Division. We will continue to admit the same number of students maintaining our student credit hours. When the Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy Studies degree is discontinued, all students must complete a bachelor's degree prior to starting in the professional program. As a result, students will be seeking other related majors to finish thus positively increasing student credit hours and graduation rates for those disciplines. As many students already complete a large number of undergraduate courses in those disciplines through their junior year, and this change would only affect approximately 10 students per year, a large impact on these disciplines is not expected. Advising for the occupational therapy program will continue as normal at the undergraduate level to effectively prepare students for admission to the occupational therapy program.
