# Program Request University of Utah Anthropology, B.A./B.S. with Emphasis in Archaeological Science 02/02/2016

# Section I: Request

This proposal requests the addition of an emphasis in Archaeological Science. The proposed emphasis specifies topical and elective courses as series of required courses focused on scientific methods in archaeology in order to provide students with skills necessary to be competitive for employment in private and government sectors or for graduate school programs.

An emphasis in Archaeological Science is not necessary for an anthropology degree, as the degree can be completed without an emphasis. As with the "regular" anthropology degree (no emphases), the emphasis in Archaeological Science can be taken as either a BA or BS. The completion of the requirements for the emphasis will not affect the number of credit hours required for the major, as both the number of classes and credits are essentially the same as the Anthropology major with or without emphases.

The proposed emphasis in Archaeological Science was designed by archaeologists in our department, and then approved by the Department of Anthropology curriculum committee in November of 2015. The emphasis was then approved by a vote in a full Anthropology faculty meeting in January of 2016. The proposal was reviewed by the College of Social and Behavioral Sciences curriculum committee in April of 2016.

#### Section II: Need

Currently, the Department of Anthropology offers a variety of core courses in archaeological science, but these are not organized into a coherent program. There are a growing number of students interested in archaeology, both out of general interest and out of a desire career preparation. Moreover, private sector archaeological and environmental consulting firms and government agencies in the region require well trained archaeologists to fill growing positions. These student- and employment-driven demands suggest there is a significant need for such a program. Moreover, by providing an emphasis in archaeological science, the Department of Anthropology should help reduce time to degree and reduce the workload on academic advisors who now must redundantly design such programs ad hoc with each student. Other institutions in the intermountain region have undergraduate programs in anthropology within which students may enroll in archaeological courses, but this would be a unique emphasis in the area focused on training students in the science of archaeology.

#### Section III: Institutional Impact

Because the proposed emphasis simply organizes existing coursework, the proposed change will not alter instructional programs in the department or college. These changes will not place any additional burden on faculty or staff. No new facilities will be required.

#### Section IV: Finances

No new funds are required to implement the proposed changes. It is anticipated that the new program will actually save the department money by reducing the amount of time the advisor spends consulting with students by providing them with a clearly outlined course schedule.
