

## Request for Undergraduate Emphasis Geriatric Nursing Leadership (RN – BS)

In 2008, more than 50% of patients in hospitals were over 65. Yet, of the 2.2 million registered nurses in the U.S., less than 1% were certified in Gerontology. (John A. Hartford Foundation). Students who graduate from the University of Utah College of Nursing with an emphasis in Geriatric Nursing Leadership will be prepared to fill in this gap in care provision.

The Geriatric Nursing Leadership (GNL) curriculum is offered within the RN – BS program. Students enroll for the same program of study as RN – BS students, with two exceptions: they take a separate research course, and their elective is pre-designated with a course created specifically for GNL students. Curriculum is enhanced with geriatric exemplars, and course modifications utilize Geriatric Nursing Education Consortium materials from the John H. Hartford Foundation and the American Association of Colleges of Nursing. Two specialized courses have been developed: Applications of Research in Aging and Best Practices in Geriatric Nursing. Current clinical content (pain management, end of life care, prevention of falls, pressure ulcers) and leadership/management skills (human resource management, teaching, mentoring, quality improvement) relevant to the geriatric nurse leader are core to the program.

Students in the Geriatric Nursing Leadership cohort graduate with the educational foundation to sit for national board certification (Geriatric Nurse), have obtained a concentrated body of knowledge in a field of nursing with a severe shortage, and when combined with their work experience, are prepared for leadership roles or to seek further education at the DNP or PhD level. Throughout the program of study, curriculum is focused on the care of older adults in all settings, and an emphasis is placed on leadership development.

The program of study has been developed so that each semester the student receives a geriatricintensive experience/class. This reinforces the geriatric materials and exemplars in the nongeriatric intensive courses. All faculty are geriatric experts affiliated with the University of Utah Hartford Center of Geriatric Nursing Excellence. Coursework culminates to a final studentdeveloped and implemented best practice/quality improvement project in the workplace.
