Section I: Action

The Department of Theatre at the University of Utah proposes that the following emphasis areas be entered on BFA Theatre transcripts:

Actor Training Program
Performing Arts Design Program
Stage Management

Regardless of emphasis, students pursuing a BFA in Theatre are required to begin their studies by developing a working knowledge of the foundations of theatre as both an art form and a cultural phenomenon. Courses to be taken in the first year of study include Script Analysis, Theatre and Theory, Acting I, and Scenography. Each course provides students with the building blocks necessary to pursue more advanced study in their areas of emphasis and to understand the work of those in other emphasis areas, which is fundamental for theatre as both a collaborative and interdisciplinary art form.

In general, students declare their area of emphasis at the start of their first year of study. For example, students entering the Actor Training Program are accepted annually, by audition only. Thus, they must declare their major by the beginning of their first year in the program. Most students who are interested in the Performing Arts Design Program and the Stage Management program also declare their emphasis at the beginning of their first year of study at the University.

Once a student has declared or been admitted to an area of emphasis, faculty mentors guide students through a specialized educational experience that develops the skills required to practice a specific craft—either acting, design, or stage management. Each course in the student's respective area of emphasis is intended to build discipline-specific knowledge (e.g., in Second Year Voice and Speech, acting students learn the International Phonetic Alphabet) and skills (e.g., in Costume Construction design students learn basic sewing and construction skills as they relate to costume design) that are commonly required of professionals. In addition, courses nurture creative thinking, improve skills in collaboration, and hone critical abilities. Upon graduation, students are prepared for graduate training or immediate employment in their area of emphasis.

See Appendix for detailed programs of study for each of the proposed emphases.

Section II: Need

Listing emphasis areas on transcripts would bring clarity to the area of study. When students apply to graduate school or for employment it would make it easier to determine in which professional area the candidate has most expertise. This would make it more convenient for the school or place of employment to determine the focus area rather than guessing by reviewing each transcript.
